

## Naches Ranger District / Firewood Cutting Data

### I. Acres

### II. Naches Firewood Cutting Permit Information

- **(2017)** 704 individuals bought woodcutting permits. 3,286 total cords were sold, which is equivalent to 2.1 MMBF.
- **(2016)** 3,359 total cords were sold, which is equivalent to 2.2 MMBF.
- **(2015)** 3,515 total cords were sold, which is equivalent to 2.3 MMBF.
- **(2014)** 4,158 total cords were sold, which is equivalent to 2.7 MMBF.

Database records show that since the year 2000, the Naches Ranger District has sold 11,975 firewood cutting permits consisting of 58,389 cords of firewood.

- The average number of permits sold each year from 2000 to 2017 is 665 permits.
- The average number of cords sold each year from 2000 to 2017 is 3,243.8 cords, which is equivalent to 2.15 MMBF per year.
